Sanitary Sewer Lining to Begin

Cleveland -----During the weeks of June 27th and July 4th, The County's lining contractor, Inland Waters Pollution Control will be working on lining certain sanitary sewer sections along Brookpark Rd. in the City of Parma and Ridge Rd. in the City of Brooklyn (please see the sections highlighted in yellow on the attached maps). The residents and business owners affected in these areas will be notified in writing by the contractor. Work will occur during the evening to reduce inconveniences to the property owners and traveling public.

The County chose a cured in place pipe (CIPP) methodology which is quicker, less expensive and less disruptive to install than the typical open cut replacement. This process also prevents root intrusion and infiltration of groundwater into the system which may cause flooding and sewer back-ups in basements to occur.

This technology has been proven over the last 20 years and will extend the life of the sanitary sewers by more than 50 years. This methodology essentially installs a new resin pipe inside the old clay tile sewer main without digging up the streets. The liner pipe is inserted in to the main through existing manholes and cured in place with a heat process. Any given segment, which is typically 300-400 feet, is usually completed in one working day. Service line connections are reopened using a robotic cutter and remote cameras. During the process, existing sewer flows are bypassed using pumps.
