Parma residents to receive new waste and recycling carts from Rumpke

CLEVELAND, Ohio – Jan. 8, 2021 – Rumpke Waste & Recycling began delivering carts to Parma residents this week. Residents are instructed not to use their Rumpke carts until Feb. 1, 2021.

Rumpke has been confirmed as City of Parma's new service provider. Under the new service agreement, Rumpke will provide weekly trash and weekly recycling collection to residents, including the use of a Rumpke trash and recycling cart. Residents will also receive weekly bulk pickup, an upgrade in service.

"With Rumpke, residents will not be required to separate yard waste and will have weekly bulk pickup — a convenience they have wanted and one we are happy to now provide," said Parma Mayor Tim DeGeeter. "We are a big city, so I am asking for residents' patience because it will take some time for the former service provider to take away its carts after its final collection the last week of January."

Instructional information has been mailed to Parma residents. Rumpke carts should not be used until Feb. 1. The current service provider will begin removing carts on Jan. 25, 2021, and it will take four weeks to remove carts from all City of Parma households. Residents are instructed not to fill their Republic Services carts after their last January collection and to keep them on their tree lawns for removal.

"We are looking forward to serving the residents of Parma," said Paul Marker, Rumpke region vice president. "We will continue to work collaboratively with the city to ensure the best service for the whole community."
